Last Year's Winner of the Individual Stage Manager Award was Steph Curtis, company stage manager for Kneehigh's production of The Red Shoes at the Asylum as well as a UK-wide and international tour, with the team award going to Claire Essex, Sarah Tryfan and Rebecca Carnell who were on Charged by Clean Break Theatre Company at the Soho Theatre, an extraordinary project which saw 6 plays in 3 different spaces at the theatre over two evenings, with audience members promenading between them.

This year will also see the return of the Stage Management Student of the Year Award, sponsored by Global Design Solutions, an important new award last year won by Charlotte Archer from Mountview Academy of Theatre Arts.

'The National Stage Management Awards are an excellent opportunity to celebrate the hard work and dedication of stage managers up and down the country in their relentless attention to detail and tireless work ethic' says Sharon Calcutt, acting Executive Director for the SMA.
